UD SCHOOL OF LAW OFFERS FREE INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

DAYTON, Ohio -- Under the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, students in the University of Dayton's School of Law will prepare federal, state and city income tax returns free of charge for Dayton-area residents who qualify under generous income guidelines.

The service, certified by the Internal Revenue Service, is offered on a first-come, first-served basis in the Law School Clinic in the basement of Albert Emanuel Hall, located on the southeast corner of Alberta and K Streets. The clinic is open 5:30 to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 10 to 11:30 a.m. on Saturday through April 15. The clinic is closed on Friday.

Those who qualify for the service are asked to bring W-2 forms, 1099 forms, information about deductions and income from other sources, last year's income tax return and blank income tax forms. Tax returns are prepared as individuals wait. Last year, UD law students prepared more than 1,000 returns.
