### UD'S PRELAW PROGRAM OFFERING A PREP COURSE FOR LAW SCHOOL ADMISSION TEST (LSAT) IN SEPTEMBER

DAYTON, Ohio – The University of Dayton's prelaw program is sponsoring a preparatory course for the Law School Admission Test (LSAT). The two-weekend, four-part course (Sept. 10-11 and Sept. 17-18) is designed to help students increase their scores on the LSAT.

Cost of the course is \$85, which includes the two weekend sessions, a complete run-through of the LSAT, a test preparation book for each participant and test-taking strategies for each section of the test.

The course is for anyone thinking about taking the LSAT during 1999-2000. Enrollment is limited to 100 people and deadline for registration is Friday, Sept. 3.

The course will include:

- A complete LSAT test — given so instructors can teach specifically to an individual's needs.
- Test-taking strategies — to introduce participants to a variety of ways to approach the test, to handle anxieties and to maximize scores.
- Analytical reasoning strategies — to teach participants how to diagram and solve logic puzzles. Logical reasoning and reading techniques — to help detect basic inferences and deductions, recognize various arguments and develop other skills required in these sections.
- Analysis of individual writing samples — each sample will be reviewed and participants will receive detailed individual comments as well as a session on how to write this sample more effectively.

All sessions are taught by professors from the University of Dayton School of Law and UD's English and philosophy departments, along with sessions led by Roberta Alexander, director of the University's prelaw program.
