TUESDAY, SEPT. 21: HUMAN RIGHTS SLATED FOR UD LUNCH DISCUSSION

As part of the events for Hispanic Heritage Month at the University of Dayton, Mark Ensalaco, director of international studies and human rights studies program, will speak from 12:10 to 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 21, in Kennedy Union Room 207. The title of his presentation is "Promoting a Culture of Human Rights in the Americas: A North American's Experience."

His speech, part of a five-week brown bag series that gives students, faculty, and staff members the opportunity to discuss issues relating to Hispanic Americans in the United States today.

Events celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month at UD will run through Oct. 16. Other events will include guest speakers such as Maria Hinojosa, a CNN reporter, as well as ethnic dinners, a dance, a movie and presentations on Latin American culture.
