JUNE 24: SCHOOL SAFETY, SECURITY FOCUS OF SEMINAR AT UD'S KELLER HALL

Violent threats, discipline codes and metal detectors will be topics of discussion at a school safety seminar from 8:45 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Thursday, June 24, in the Mathias Heck Courtroom at the University of Dayton's Keller Hall.

The Education Law Association, a nonprofit organization housed at UD that promotes interest in and understanding of the legal framework of education, will host the conference with UD's School of Education and Allied Professions, UD's School of Law and the Dayton Area Superintendents' Association.

John Concannon, general counsel for the Cincinnati Public Schools and Robert Morgan, security chief for Cincinnati Public Schools, will share their experiences with school safety and security at 10 a.m. on Thursday in the Heck Courtroom. "Any issue that affects a student being safe in school will be discussed," Concannon said.

There will also be a legislation update on recent federal and state decisions at 9 a.m. and a mock hearing concerning teacher contract termination at 1:30 p.m.

University of Dayton graduates living in the Cincinnati area are sponsoring a fund-raiser to benefit the Jacque and Lee Cook Memorial Scholarship Fund, created by UD to ensure that Ryan Cook, whose parents were killed in the April tornado, can finish his college education.

The fund-raiser begins at 4 p.m. Friday, June 25, at Christy's Rathskeller and Biergarten, 151 W. McMillan. The band Patsy's DeCline will perform and sound will be provided by C&D Audio Productions & Design. Proceeds from the \$5 cover charge and a raffle will benefit the scholarship fund.

More than 200 donations totaling more than \$20,000 have been received for the fund. After Cook graduates, remaining money will be used to assist other UD students in similar circumstances.

Lee Cook graduated with a master's degree in metallurgical engineering at UD in 1973. Ryan will be a sophomore in psychology this fall.
