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**UD WINS NATIONAL AWARDS
FOR VIDEO PRODUCTIONS**

DAYTON, Ohio — Videos produced by members of the University of Dayton faculty and staff recently earned national recognition from two broadcasting associations.

Alan Hueth, assistant professor of communication, won second place in the educational or instructional category in the Broadcast Education Association's juried faculty video production competition for "Getting Ready: Becoming an Electrician," one of 26 "School-to-Work" videos produced last year for use in schools. Hueth came up with the concept for the Career Video Library series, which is available to school districts throughout the state, and wrote the scripts, which were produced by the University's Center for Business and Economic Research.

Hueth, a Miamisburg resident, will accept the award on April 18 at the association's annual conference in Las Vegas.

The Center for Business and Economic Research won three Bronze Tellys in the 20th annual Telly Awards, a national video awards competition to showcase and give recognition to outstanding commercials, films and video programs.

One of the videos recognized for excellence was the 1998 campaign video produced by CBER for Culture Works. It contained computer animation created by UD students in computer modeling and animation classes taught by Tim Wilbers, associate professor of visual arts.

Two videos from the Career Video Library were also honored with Telly Awards, "Getting Ready: Becoming an Electrician" and "Stop the Noise." Both episodes were written by Hueth, and Mike Kurtz, manager of CBER Video and a resident of Hamilton, served as producer, director and editor of the series. UD students served as videographers for the series.

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“Stop the Noise” is designed to help students in third through fifth grades learn the fundamental communication skills needed to get and keep a job. “Getting Ready: Becoming an Electrician” is designed for middle school and high school students and illustrates the educational preparation and career of an electrician.
