FRIDAY, FEB. 19: UD FACULTY TO DEBATE TEN BEST MOVIES OF ALL TIME

Three times each semester, a group of University of Dayton faculty members get together to discuss topic ranging from affirmative action to the University budget.

However, the topic of this week's faculty discussion has the potential for heated debate because anyone could be considered an expert.

"Which are the 10 best movies ever?" will be the focus of discussions at 3 p.m. Friday, Feb. 19, in the Miriam Hall Room 104.

James Farrelly, a professor of English at UD who regularly teaches film and literature classes, will look at the American Film Institute's top choices and popular "guy" and "girl" movie favorites. Alan Hueth, an assistant professor of communication, and Robin Kenner, a film critic for *Impact Weekly* (formerly known as the *Dayton Voice*), will also be panelists in the discussion.

A prayer vigil for Death Row inmate Wilford Berry Jr. will be held at 8 p.m. Friday, Feb. 19, in the Immaculate Conception Chapel at the University of Dayton.

Songs and prayers will be offered, and readings will include excerpts from *Dead Man Walking* by Sister Helen Prejean and writings by Bernice King, daughter of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. The vigil is expected to last until at least 9 p.m., the time of Berry's scheduled execution.
