OCT 19-26: DISTRICT JUDGE WALTER RICE BRINGS COURT TO UD'S KELLER HALL

Chief Judge Walter H. Rice of the U.S. District Court for Southern Ohio will be a jurist-in-residence at the University of Dayton's Joseph E. Keller School of Law for one week starting on Monday, Oct. 19.

During his residence at UD, Rice will meet with UD law students and actually hold court in the Mathias Heck Courtroom. However, cameras are not permitted while court is in session.

Cameras are permitted during a naturalization ceremony at 2:45 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 22, in the Mathias Heck Courtroom. Several people will recite the oath to become U.S. citizens during the ceremony.

University of Dayton students will leave campus for a few hours during the weekend to do something for their community.

Into the Streets is an annual event that gives students a chance to work with children, the elderly, homeless, and the environment. It's a two-day event that begins on Friday, Oct. 23, and ends on Saturday, Oct. 24.

Some of the events will include:

Not So Scary Halloween — From 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 23, at Aullwood Audabon Society on Frederick Pike, students will set up fire pits and get ready for the "Enchanted Forest." From 5:45 to 9:30 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 23, students will dress up in costumes and walk with children through the "Not So Haunted House," located at The Castle, 133 N. Main St.

Moving the Ronald McDonald House — From 2:45 to 6:15 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 23, students will be at Ronald McDonald House, located at 741 Valley St. They will help organize and stock shelves in the new house and help move items from the former location.

Thrifty Shopping — From 3 to 6 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 23, and from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 24, students will sort clothes and stock shelves at the St. Francis Thrift Store, located at 1235 N. Keowee St.

Artists in Residence — From 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 24, students will clean up a showroom so that the art work of mentally disabled people can be displayed. The We Care Arts showroom, where the students are cleaning, is located at 610 Watervliet Ave.

Wetlands Restoration — From 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 24, students will help clear sites, construct trails and boardwalks and repair minor damages at the Beaver Creek Wetlands, located off Factory Road in Beaver Creek.

Growing With Neighbors — From 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 24, students will plant trees in the Fairgrounds neighborhood. The trees will be planted on the corner of Fairground Avenue and Main Street behind Denny's restaurant.

Trick-or-Treating for Cans — From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 24, students will trick-or-treat for canned goods in the city of Oakwood. They will donate the food to the St. Vincent Depaul center. Students will meet in front of UD's Liberty Hall at 11 a.m.
