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No Paper Chase: Law Web Site Allows Students to Apply Online for Free

LAW WEB SITE ALLOWS STUDENTS TO APPLY ONLINE FOR FREE**

DAYTON, Ohio — No more paper chase for law students applying to the University of Dayton.

Prospective students can now apply online (<http://www.law.udayton.edu>), and the University will waive the \$40 application fee. A number of law schools offer an application that can be printed out and mailed in, but few offer a click-and-send application, according to Jack Cox, acting assistant dean and director of admission and financial aid in the School of Law.

"The opportunity to apply online is offered as a convenience to prospective law students. It's another step in affirming both a high-tech and high-touch environment at our law school," Cox said.

The newly redesigned law admission site is user-friendly. It offers prospective students five ways to apply. They can apply online, download and print the application, request a paper application or pay \$49.95 and apply through one of two Law School Admission Council's computerized application processes.

The site also includes a virtual tour of Keller Hall, the new, technologically sophisticated home of the University of Dayton's law school, and offers timely information about courses, faculty, career options, student life and ways to finance law school. It displays a day-by-day admission recruitment schedule in cities across the country.

Between 1,100 and 1,500 prospective students vie for 175 seats in the first-year class each year, according to Cox. The University of Dayton's School of Law enrolls 485 students.
