UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON APPOINTS FOUR NEW TRUSTEES

DAYTON, Ohio — The University of Dayton has appointed a local bank president and three alumni to the board of trustees.

The new trustees are:

- Mervyn L. Alphonso, president of KeyBank's Dayton district who's active in K-12 education reform efforts in the community. He holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the College of Saint Rose and an MBA from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.
- The Rev. Joseph H. Lackner, S.M., assistant provincial and director of education for the Cincinnati Province of the Society of Mary. He earned a bachelor's degree in English from UD in 1964 and a master's in counselor education in 1984. He holds two doctorates: a Ph.D. in historical theology from St. Louis University in 1977 and an Ed.D. in private school education from the University of San Francisco in 1997.
- John McHale, a 1978 electrical engineering graduate and entrepreneur in Austin, Texas. He founded two computer networking companies, NetWorth Inc. and NetSpeed Inc. In 1996, he donated \$1.25 million to UD to help create the Donoher Basketball Center.
- Jack Proud, a division president at Reynolds and Reynolds Co. and a 1970 alumnus with a bachelor's degree in psychology. He is president of UD's National Alumni Association board of directors.

Stepping off the board after completing their terms are Senator Richard H. Finan, Richard F. Glennon, Max Gutmann and the Rev. James F. Fitz, S.M.
