The University Libraries are launching a new electronic publishing and archiving service:
eCommons (ecommons.udayton.edu).

eCommons is a rapidly growing online repository of digital materials representing the University of Dayton's scholarly and creative output. This service enables faculty, staff and students to preserve their work and disseminate it to a worldwide audience.

Faculty and staff can:

- Archive their scholarly and creative work
- Disseminate their work to the world and make it more findable by Google
- Demonstrate impact with monthly download statistics
- Host a journal, conference, digital book, image collection and more.

Faculty and researchers have the right to retain the rights to use and distribute their scholarship. However, that right is not always evident in author contracts and publisher agreements. Scholarly materials in electronic form can be made widely accessible in a manner that greatly increases their use and utility for readers. If the higher education community manages intellectual property rights properly, it can facilitate wide dissemination of scholarship in ways that significantly enhance the growth and development of knowledge.

This session will describe open access publishing and funding options for author fees, as well as national and international efforts to educate authors about their rights. A sample author addendum will also be distributed.
