History of the Christophers

The Christophers were founded in 1945 by Father James Keller, M.M. The group's mission is "to put hope into action," and advocates that every person has a "God-given mission" to make a positive difference in the world. Although founded by a Maryknoll priest, the group is not limited to Catholics and argues for religious tolerance. The name "The Christophers" comes from the Greek word "christophoros," meaning "Christ-bearer."

The Christophers are most widely known for their series of Christopher News Notes pamphlets, published on a variety of spiritual and social topics. They also produce a weekly radio show and podcast, offer leadership courses, and honor books and visual media with the annual Christopher Awards.

Scope and Contents

The first series contains prayer cards printed and distributed by the Christophers. The rest of the collection is made up of pamphlets from the Christopher News Notes series. It is not a complete set of the pamphlets.
