#### **Agenda Items:**

- 1. Minutes from March 31<sup>st</sup> approved
- 2. We voted separately and in each case unanimously for
  - SEHS nomination of Janet Herrelko to CAP-L
  - CAS-HUM nomination of Kelly Vibber to CAP-L
  - Reappointment of Tom Hirunyawipada (SBA) to CAP-L
  - Reappointment of Todd Smith (CAS-NS) to CAP-L
- 3. Undergraduate Certificate in International and Intercultural Leadership

We had a discussion about the revised version of the proposed certificate and recommend for next year's APC to invite the proposers to an in-person discussion. The major issues that were raised during the discussion are

- 1. Even with the redefinition of leadership (which some members felt could be misleading since this is not what most people think of when they read the student has a certificate in International and Intercultural <u>Leadership</u>), still only 1-3 credit hours are spent on tying the various classes together from a leadership perspective.
- 2. If a Stander Symposium presentation is meant to be mandatory this should be more clearly stated in the requirements
- 3. It is still unclear, especially given the fact that there are already international studies, international business and language minors, why this is not proposed as a minor? What is the rationale behind establishing this as an undergraduate certificate? The only difference between a minor and a certificate is that a certificate is a set of courses that can be taken by themselves (stand alone) -- not only by students pursuing an undergraduate degree. How will this certificate be marketed to and administered for people who are not UD undergraduate students?
