## **1992 STUDY ABROAD SESSION OPEN TO DAYTON RESIDENTS**

DAYTON, Ohio -- This summer, residents of the Dayton community are invited to travel and learn about Europe with students and faculty of the University of Dayton.

The Interdepartmental Summer Study Abroad Program (ISSAP) offers an opportunity to live, study and travel in Europe for more than three weeks per session plus an opportunity to earn up to six college credit hours per site. This year, travelers with ISSAP can choose from Berlin, Madrid, Paris and London.

The fees vary according to the number of sites visited, but the estimated cost for one-site participation, without air fare, ground transportation or spending money, will be about \$2,115.

Participants can choose from over 25 classes that include "The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich" in Berlin, "Cultural Aspects of Food" in Paris, "Renaissance, Baroque and Rococo Art History" in Madrid and "Sights and Sounds of Music" in London.

Classes are held four days a week and time is allowed between sessions for independent travel.

The opportunity gives students a unique opportunity to combine travel and to gain first-hand experience of European culture in a new manner.
